# **School Dinners**

Please note the following important information regarding selecting your child's school dinner:

- Meal selections must be made via the MCAS App.
- If no meal choice is submitted, a vegetarian option will be provided for your child.
- You can select your child's meal the evening before, ready for the following day.
- All meal choices must be submitted by 9:30am each day at the latest.

We appreciate your cooperation in using this system to help us provide your child with a smooth and enjoyable lunchtime experience.

If you have any issues accessing or using the MCAS App, please do not hesitate to contact the school office for support.

### Coats

As we move further into autumn, we'd like to kindly remind all parents and carers to ensure that your child is bringing a coat to school each day. Mornings are noticeably colder, and a warm layer will help keep students comfortable throughout the day, particularly during break and lunch when they are outside.

### Don't be late

Please also remember - punctuality is a key part of success at Heckmondwike Academy. We ask that all pupils **arrive at school by 8:40am** so they are ready to join their lines and take part in the Morning Welcome. **This is a crucial part of our daily routine** and sets a positive tone for the day.

All absences must be reported via telephone to the academy office before 8:30am on the day of absence and any subsequent days.

# **Holiday Requests:**

Please note that **holidays during term time are not permitted**. Any requests must be made through a formal meeting with Mr Singh and Mr Wilson in advance of any planned leave. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us maintain high standards.

## **MCAS System**
